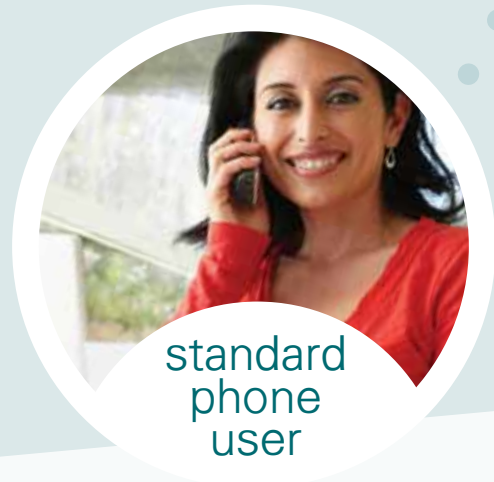

how does video assisted speech to speech relay (V-A STS) work?

- 1** Speech impaired user connects to a STS RA (Relay Assistant) by calling toll free 0800 8 715 715.
- 2** Once connected with the STS RA, the speech impaired user can request Video-Assisted STS and give their Skype screen name to the STS RA.
- 3** The Video-Assisted STS RA will initiate a one-way video connection with the STS user via Skype.
- 4** The STS user will provide the phone number of the standard phone user to the Video-Assisted STS RA.
- 5** The Video-Assisted STS RA will place a telephone call to the standard phone user using standard STS RA procedures. The Video-Assisted STS RA will be able to see the STS customer via video. This technology makes this service suited to speech impaired users.
- 6** The STS user will talk to the standard phone user on the telephone with the Video-Assisted STS RA providing support as requested.
